THE KANSAS HONEY PRODUCERS AND MISSOURI STATE BEEKEEPERS ASSOCIATION 1992 FALL MEETING OCTOBER 9-10 AT THE HOLIDAY INN OLATHE, KANSAS (913) 829-4000

A very special meeting has been planned for the fall 1992 state meeting. We will have a joint TWO-DAY meeting with the Kansas Honey Producers on October 9-10, 1992. The agenda and registration forms are on the following pages. We have several tremendous workshops planned for Saturday afternoon at the home of Joli Winer and Cecil Sweeney (owner's of MID-CON). The main workshop will be with DR. LARRY CONNOR, who will work a live bee hive with a group of about 12 beekeepers at a time. We will rotate in small controlled groups from one workshop to the next. The cost for registration on Friday is \$5 per person, and the cost for Saturday is \$25 per person or \$35 per family couple. The registration fee on Saturday includes a shuttle bus ride from the HOLIDAY INN to the afternoon workshops and back to the HOLIDAY INN.

This is a once in a lifetime opportunity to gather an unlimited amount of beekeeping knowledge in a two day period. We also encourage you to attend the banquet and auction Friday night which will be a lot of fun.

This is the first year that we have a HONEY QUEEN, MISS JULIE BATTON from Poplar Bluff. Julie has already been a big help to us by promoting honey at the state fair and giving interviews on the radio. We need your SUPPORT OF THE QUEEN PROGRAM to make this a success. You can do this by donating items to the AUCTION on Friday night OR by making a cash donation. PLEASE plan to attend the AUCTION because this will be a lot of fun.

We are also going to have a HONEY CONTEST on Friday and the winners in each category will be auctioned off Friday night. All proceeds from the auction will be split 50-50 between the KANSAS and MISSOURI HONEY QUEEN PROGRAMS.

- Class #3 - Chunk Honey (2-1lb. queen line jars)
- Class #4 - Cut Comb Honey (2-4x4 plastic boxes)
- Class #5 - Creamed Honey (2-1lb. queen line jars)
- Class #6 - Beeswax (1 pound)
- Class #7 - Beeswax Sculpture (any size or design)

GUIDELINES FOR THE KANSAS-MISSOURI HONEY SHOW

1. Entries must be received by 9:00 A.M. on October 9, 1992.
2. \$1.00 entry fee per person. You may enter as many classes as you wish.
3. Entries in Classes 1 and 2 should be displayed in 2 two-pound queen line jars.
4. Entries in Classes 3 and 5 should be displayed in 2 one-pound queen line jars.
5. Entries in Classes 4 shall be displayed in plastic cut comb boxes.
6. No labels are to be placed on jars prior to judging. Please bring labels to place on entries after judging is completed.
7. For entries receiving 1st place, one jar of the two entered will be placed in the fund raising auction.
8. Entries will be released between 4:00p.m. and 4:30p.m. on October 9, 1992. Entries not picked up at that time will be placed in the fund raising auction.
