Wow, has it been two years already? The beekeeping industry in Missouri has seen several changes in the last two years. The price of honey has skyrocketed and then settled a bit. Small Hive Beetles have been found in the state. It looks like the Varroa Mite is becoming resistant to Apistan and Checkmite. And Chris Gibbons is moving over to the position of Past President while I move from Vice President to President.

Over the last two years the board has repeatedly asked "how can we involve more people in the State Association?" One of the answers to that question has been for the board to actively seek people from different parts of the state to come onto the board and add their input. We have found people from "the four corners of the State" that are willing to be Directors, Ray Batton in the SE corner, May Schmidt South-Central, Glenn Davis in the Northwest corner, and Steve Harris in the Northeast corner. Art has dedicated a large portion of his summers for the past 6+ years to the fair project. I want to publicly thank Art the wonderful job he has done.

Every year the The Missouri Governor's Conference on Agriculture is held in December.

This year the conference will start on December 12th at Tan-Tar-A. The Missouri State Beekeeper's Association will be at the "Taste of AgriMissouri" Reception serving salad with a honey dressing. Rich Ramsey President HAS Past Pres. Ill State Beekeepers Assn. The following amendments to the By-Laws of the Missouri State Beekeeper's Association are being proposed. They will be presented to the membership at the Spring 2005 Meeting of the Association to be voted on. As required by the by-laws, these proposed amendments are being presented to the membership at least 30 days before the meeting.

At the recent board meeting before the Fall Meeting, the following changes to the by-laws of the Association were discussed. Previously, the past president was considered a "director". Only three Directors were allowed including the past president. This appears to be an error because there were more than three Directors at the time that the By-Laws were voted on last year. The following changes to the by-laws would make the by-laws consistent with the current status of the Directors. It also formally recognizes the Past President as the "chairperson" of the directors and removes the Past President from the position of "Director".

Proposed changes to the by-laws of the Missouri State Beekeeper's Association

Article 4: Officers and Elections

Section 5: Tenure

Subsection C: Directors shall serve a term of three years, one Director being nominated and elected each year. One directore shall be the

out going President and shall serve for two years. Each local Association shall elect from their membership, one board member of the

State Association each year to serve at the pleasure of the President.

Proposed change-Subsection C-Directors shall serve a term of two years, two directors being nominated and elected each year. Each local Association shall

elect, from their membership, one board member of the State Association each year to serve at the pleasure of the President.

Subsection D: The State shall be divided into three sections, northeast, northwest, and southcentral. Each Director shall be an advisor to

their section of the State reporting to the outgoing President/Director any pertinent issues of concern.

Proposed change-Subsection D-The State shall be divided into four sections; northeast, northwest, southeast, and southwest. Each Director shall be an

advisor to their section of th State, reporting to the Past President any pertinent issues of concern.

Article 6: Executive Committee

Section 2: The outgoing President shall be one of the Directors with a two-year term of office.

Proposes change--The outgoing President, also known as the "Past President", shall be Chairman of the Directors with a two year term of Office.


