### Honey Carrot Cake

3 cups flour

2 teaspoons baking soda

1 teaspoon salt

l cup oil

1 ½ cup honey

4 eggs beaten

2 cups grated carrots

2 teaspoons vanilla extract

1teaspoon Nutmeg

1/2 teaspoon Allspice

2 teaspoons Cinnamon

Optional ingredients

1/2 cups chopped Walnuts

1/2 cups Raisins

3 tablespoons Pineapple

1/2 cup coconut

Mix all dry ingredients then add moist ingredients and blend in carrots plus any options. Bake at 350 for 20 to 30 minutes in 2 layer pans

### Honey Ice Cream

2 cups cream

2 cups milk

3/4 cup honey

2 teaspoon vanilla

optional ingredients

2 cups Strawberries

1/2 cup bakers cocoa

1 1/2 cups lemon Juice

3 1/2 cups orange






